This year Assembly was held from June 9 - 11 at the Scarborough Chinese Baptist Church with more than 325 in-person delegates and a large number participating on line Voting privileges were restricted to in-person delegates.



Can you believe that it's September?! But, as I like to say, summer's not over yet, not until the 22nd. And what a summer it's been: hot and dry! In all that stifling heat, guess what I had to do? I had to try to reseed part of our lawn!

You see, we had work done that required a trench to be dug across the width of our back yard to improve the drainage and, before the city would sign off on the work permit, they had to see beautiful, green grass growing where the trench had been dug. So, I broke up the clumps of clay (which is all there is in our yard under a thin layer of topsoil) and added top-dressing soil and spread the grass seed and then I watered...and watered again. The diligence paid off (the heat also helped) and we quickly had a new carpet of turf where there had been an ugly scar across our yard.

BUT the reseeding isn't finished. You see, due to the poor drainage in our yard (which the trench finally dealt with), we had less and less grass in the lawn over the years and more and more weeds. So now with better drainage it's time to reseed the *rest* of the back yard and replace unwanted weeds with lovely new grass.

Do you ever wish you could reseed your life? Have you ever looked at yourself, honestly, and thought "I don't like the character of the person looking back at me." Unfortunately, we often talk as though people can't change and that, if you're a grumpy person now, you'll be a grumpy person till the day you die. But that is *not* the message of God through the Bible. In fact, God has told us that he wants to reseed our lives with new character.

In the Bible God speaks through the writing of a man named Paul to say this:

When you follow the desires of your sinful nature, the results are very clear: sexual immorality, impurity, lustful pleasures, idolatry, sorcery, hostility, quarreling, jealousy, outbursts of anger, selfish ambition, dissension, division, envy, drunkenness, wild parties, and other sins like these. Let me tell you again, as I have before, that anyone living that sort of life will not inherit the Kingdom of God. But the Holy Spirit produces this kind of fruit in our lives: love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control. There is no law against these things! (Galatians 5:19-23, New Living Translation)

There is a kind of fruit that God wants to grow in us if we will let him. It's as though God looks at all the weeds that have grown up and says to us: "if you'll trust me, I'll reseed this whole life of yours with the kind of things you wish you had."

What's amazing to me is that these qualities that he lists are not random characteristics, but the very characteristics that define God. God wants to take his own "DNA" and implant it in us so that we become more like him and experience more of him.

I want to invite you to be part of an exploration of faith that will begin on Sunday, September 4 that I am calling "Reseeding Character: becoming reflections of God." This will be a chance for us to continue to live out the Plains Commitment to "provide an environment for people to explore, develop and celebrate our faith in God." We'll not only worship, hear God's Word, and connect, but we'll also be challenged to intentionally provide the environment that God wants in us so he can grow his qualities. Much like diligently breaking up the soil, top-dressing and watering – we want to encourage each other to make room for God to grow or keep growing his nature in us.

I'm excited to keep growing in Christ. I hope you are as well. Join us in person or online for this series. And invite someone to join you as well.
