Search Committee Update

September 2023

As you know, Rev. Robert Spicer preached for a call on Sunday August 13th and a formal letter calling him as our next pastor was sent out. I am pleased to let you know that Rob has advised us that he is delighted to accept our call and is looking forward, along with his wife Melissa and daughter Olivia, to joining the Plains family.

It may be of interest to note, that even though everyone is allowed to attend and participate in the discussion, our constitution stipulates that voting shall be limited to church members only. In matters of such magnitude as choosing a new pastor the Search Committee felt it was important not only for us as a congregation but for the candidate as well that we know how everyone felt about the candidate and had an equal opportunity to be heard. To that end, a ballot was prepared to allow both members and adherents to register their vote. It is with great pleasure that we advise you that the members voted 98% in favor and the adherents 75% in favor of calling Rev. Robert Spicer as the next pastor for First Yarmouth (Plains) Baptist Church. As it stands now, Robert will be joining us starting October 1, 2023. We have a few small details to complete including his employment agreement, which we anticipate will be in place, signed and sealed by mid-September.

The Search Committee wishes to express our deepest thanks to the congregation for its support, patience and understanding over the past 19 plus months, and for such a resounding showing of support for Robert and the future of Plains.

1. The General Fund shows a net gain as of 27th of August, 2023 of \$15,100.57. Grass cutting is paid up to June 30/23.

- 2. Missions income as at the 27th of August, 2023 totalled \$3,824.13. That amount will be forwarded to CBOQ and CBM on September 1st, 2023.
- 3. The Communion fund has a net gain as of the 27th of August, 2023 of \$1,440.84. There was a balance in that fund from previous years of \$751.87, leaving a balance of \$2,192.71 in that fund. Donations in memory of the late John Griffin totalled \$1,043.88 and that money is in the Communion Fund.
- 4. The new tables and chairs for Oak Hall have been purchased and the new electronic sign has been paid for from the Centre Street Baptist Church donations to Plains.
- 5. A very generous further donation from the closure of Centre Street Baptist Church has been received in the amount of \$30,900, as well as the \$65,000 received in 2022. Special thank you to the wonderful people of Centre Street for their kind donations to help further God's work in this community at Plains!

Once again, I would like to personally thank the wonderful people of Plains who continue to make their donations via the offering plate at the church, mailing or delivering them to my home office, using PAR (preauthorized remittance through their bank), or by etransfer.

<u>Returning to Church</u>

September is here again and with it the kids go back to school, life in churches gets busier and Sunday School and youth ministries gear up again. Even Sunday morning worship attendance often sees an uptick as people come home from holidays, trips, campers and cottages. It's a time of returning.

Unfortunately, there's often a quiet re-assessing that happens as well as the "regulars" silently observe and ask "who hasn't come back?"; a realization that some are slow to return and may not be returning. Sometimes the reasons are known, sometimes not. There's a sadness that goes along with that.

Less than a year ago now, Anne and I listened quietly as a friend of ours, with determined anger in her voice and tears in her eyes said to us: "...and that is why I will *never* EVER go back to church again...!!" We didn't try to argue with her. In fact we agreed with and understood her reasons.

But that can't be the end of the story. Not for me, not for you. To simply let someone drift away from God's people goes against the job that Jesus gave us to do. He told us to "go and make disciples" (Matthew 28:19). He told us to search for the lost sheep (Luke 15:4). If we quietly wait for people to *maybe* come back we are doing neither. We cannot force anyone to return, but we can go and be the church with them, encouraging faith, fostering a relationship of trust and praying for God's Kingdom to come.

This past Sunday I announced that I will be finishing my work as interim Pastor at Plains on Sunday, September 10th because I have accepted a position with Employment Services Elgin. This is part of a dream that God gave to me and Anne a year ago. The plan is to start a homebased community of people who want to explore and experience what faith in Christ is. Home based because there are many people who will *never* step through the doors of a church building. I will receive my income from a non-ministry source because many of those same people are cynical of where church money goes, how it is used and other abuses of power that the media has reported about the wider Church. And it will be small because that is where deep relationships are forged and where hard questions can be explored in safety. We feel called to do this, NOT because other ways of doing ministry are wrong – they aren't, we still need established churches like Plains to do the work of the Gospel in their communities. We are doing this because there is a need for *new* expressions of church, of ministry, of community and of the Gospel in order to meet the spiritual needs of those who will not return to OR who have never had anything to do with the Church and the Gospel of Jesus Christ.

Anne and I are excited (and terrified) about this next step for us. Please keep us in your prayers! We are also going to keep you in our prayers as you embark on your next exciting (and terrifying) step of forging a relationship with a new pastor and his family and as you take steps of faith together to do the job Jesus gave us all to do.
