

Highlights of the Business Meeting of April 14, 2024

Clerk Mary Crosby called the meeting to order at 12:00 p.m. A brief devotion was given by Rev. Rob Spicer. Wayne Dale was nominated as Chairperson. The minutes of the meeting of February 11, 2024 were accepted as circulated. The Agenda for the meeting of April 14 was approved as printed, with 2 additions to New Business–Delegate(s) to the CBOQ Conference in June, and a replacement on the Finance Committee

following the passing of Pat Martyn.

Committee Reports were read by committee leaders, and were approved at the end of the full presentation.

Phyllis Huffman addressed the Trustees' Report of planned projects for 2024 concerning a new dais for the sound system and a new sound board, expressing the need for both items. Approval of the congregation was given for both of these projects to proceed, along with the purchase of a new headset for the preacher. Phyllis also noted that help was needed in the sound system area, requesting that someone be found to operate the sound board for an hour each Sunday, asking if anyone knew of anyone with expertise in this area, noting that it would probably have to be a paid service.

A plaque will be purchased and installed, to recognize the financial support from Centre Street Baptist Church and its members.

The need for a up-to-date Church Photo Directory was noted, with the suggestion that planning for this begin now, in order for it to be a project in 2025 for the church's 195 Anniversary.

Louise Sargeant agreed to be the Plains Church delegate at the CBOQ convention June 13-15, 2024 in Toronto, with the opportunity for one other person to also attend. Anyone interested should contact the church, Shirley Dale or Louise Sargeant before the registration deadline of May 8, 2024

Marion Lammiman will join the Finance Committee as a member at-large.

The date of the next meeting will be October 27, 2024 at 12:00 noon. Pastor Rob Spicer closed the meeting with prayer.

 The General Fund shows a net loss as of the 30th of April,, 2024 of (-2,074.70.) The church was closed on Sunday, February 4, 2024 due to illness in the congregation, and could be part of the reason for the net loss. There were also 7 pay Sundays in the first quarter, which is part of the reason for the deficit. There would normally be 6 pay periods.

The Easter Offering to date for the General Fund totals \$170.00.

- Missions income as at the 30th of April, 2024 totalled \$1,802.68. That amount has been forwarded to CBOQ and CBM. This amount is made up as follows: CBOQ - General Budget - \$515.00; CBOQ Youth - \$800.00; CBM General Budget - \$413.68; and CBM Sharing Way - \$74.00. The Easter Offering to date for CBOQ Missions totals \$170.00.
- 3. The Communion fund had a net loss of (-386.89.) Funds left over from previous years of \$1,412.33 helps to cover that deficit and leaves a balance of \$1,025.44 in the Communion Fund.
- 4. The Special Projects Fund has a balance of \$7,090.75 for future projects. A total of \$2,284.75 in memory of Pat Martyn has been received, as well as \$25.00 in memory of Jim Rewbotham and \$25.00 in memory of Jean Lammiman.

Thank you to all the Plains Family who continue to help this church on the corner of the Oak Plains remain a thriving community of believers, spreading God's word to all.
